The Community

The City of Tucson and its surrounding suburbs is a thriving city with over 1 million residents. Vail Academy and High School is part of the Vail School District, which is located Southeast of the City. The District, which has experienced tremendous growth in the past 25 years, is widely recognized as a leader in effective instruction and innovation. The beautifully located ranching and railroad community has blossomed into a highly desirable place for families and a key economic center for the Tucson area.

The School

- Vail Academy and High School was opened in 1997 as Vail Charter High School, the first high school in the Vail School District, with 100 students.
- The school evolved from its small beginnings into a sprawling K-12 school with over 600 students at a brand new campus in 2010, when it adopted its current name.
- The school is split with 300 students in Elementary, 160 in Middle, and 100 in High School levels.
- In 2014 and in 2018, the school was awarded the prestigious A+ School of Excellence award by the Arizona Education Foundation. (Eligible again in 2023).
- All students in the school in grades 6-12 use their laptops throughout the school day as most work is completed electronically.
